# MIDWEEK OF ADVENT I

December 4,2024
EVENING PRAYER
"FOR YOU AND ALL THE WORLD"

The good news of Christ's birth is both universal and personal. The angel's proclamation, "good news of great joy... for all the people" (Luke 2:10), and the heavenly host's declaration of "peace among men" emphasize Christ's universal mission of salvation. While this good news is for all, it is also deeply personal. The angel's message to the shepherds, "for unto you is born this day... a Savior" (Luke 2:11), reminds us that this salvation is intended for each individual. As part of humanity, we are the recipients of this divine gift. What do we find in Christ? Peace. He reconciles us with the Father, bridging the gap created by sin. We who were once alienated are now brought near to God through His Son. We experience peace with Him.






The congregation's response may begin just as the leader's petition ends so that the word "Lord" is sung simultaneously by both leader and congregation.





# Lord's Prayer


- L Taught by our Lord and trusting His promises, we are bold to pray:

#### Collect for the Word




