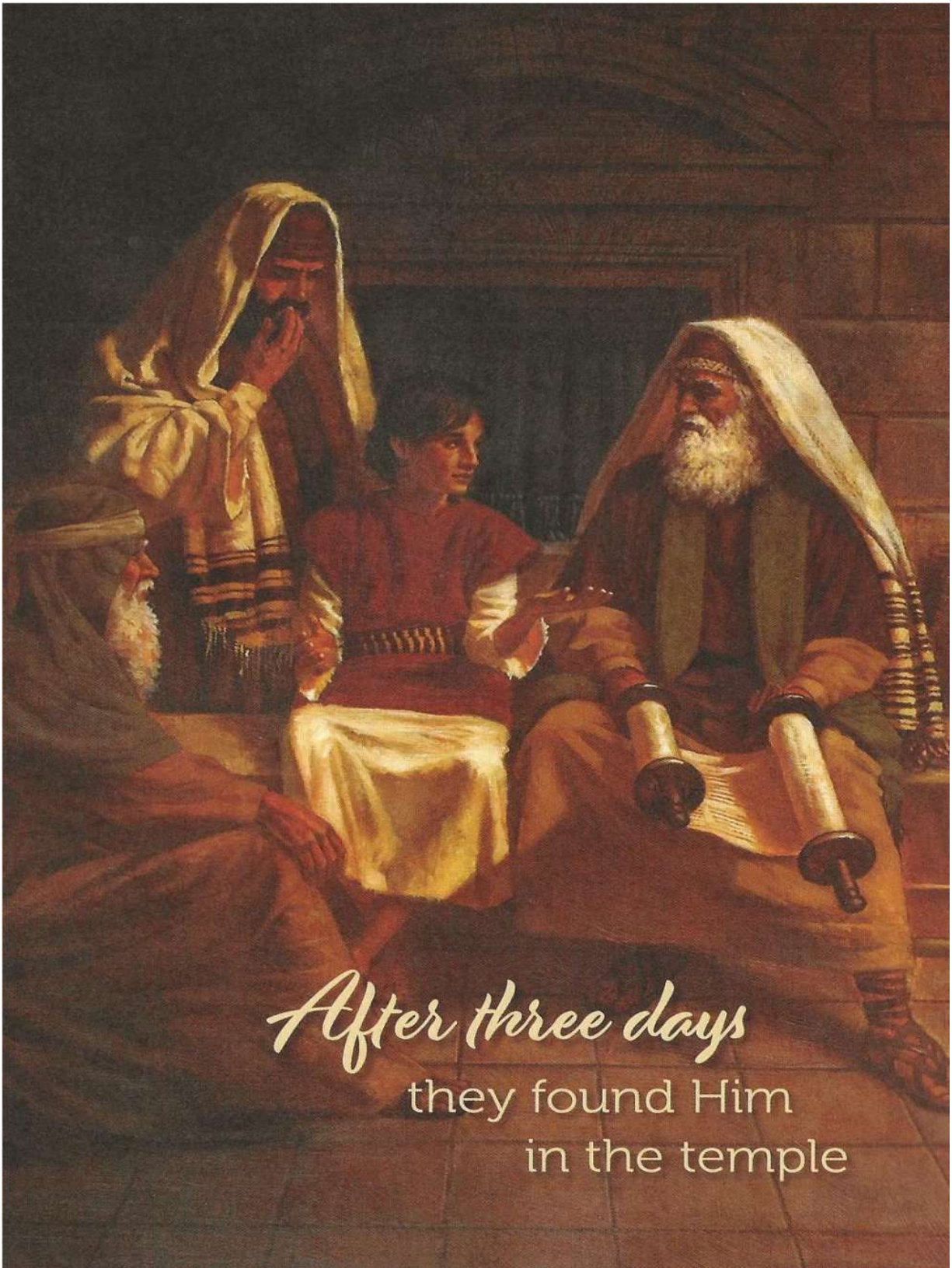

After Mary and Joseph found Him in the temple on the third day, Jesus responded, “Why were you looking for Me? Did you not know that I must be in My Father’s house?” (Luke 2:49).
