Pastor's Newsletter Article for March 2025 What Happens When We Die?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus:

This is a question that weighs heavily on all of our hearts. We yearn to know what lies beyond the veil of death. The guesses are all over the place. Some people think that we will reincarnate as a new life after we die. Others think we continue as a ghost over a favorite spot or maybe as an angel over a favorite friend.

True comfort can only be found in God's inspired and inerrant Word. The Bible, our sure and steadfast guide, reveals the glorious truth for believers. In 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, the apostle Paul paints a picture of hope that banishes fear:



"Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud

command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage each other with these words." (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

We no longer have to grieve like everyone else who may still be guessing about what happens to us when we die. The question has been answered for us. By his death, Jesus paid for our sins. By his resurrection, Jesus guarantees that those who believe in him will have life with him after death. We will spend eternity with him in glory!

When Jesus returns, those who have died in faith will rise first, and we who remain will be caught up to meet Him in the air. We will then spend eternity with our Savior, experiencing the fullness of His love and joy.

This promise, grounded in the atoning sacrifice of Christ on the cross (Romans 5:8) and the power of His resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:20), frees us from the anxieties of the unknown. We can face death with confidence, knowing that it is not an end, but a glorious beginning!

Now, since we know that those who fall asleep in Jesus will enter life in heaven, **Let's dedicate** ourselves to sharing this good news with others. Let us make sure that all our loved ones know the truth about God's love for them and the hope of eternal life in Christ. God grant that we all find confidence in knowing that, through faith in Jesus Christ, we will be together forever with the Lord in heaven—reunited with Him and with all those who have gone before us in faith forever with the Lord in heaven.




You are always welcome to any of our Bible classes!

The Elders approved the purchase of two systems to upgrade our digital security.

Firewall acts as a security barrier, a network security device designed to monitor, filter and control incoming and outgoing network traffic based on predetermined security rules. Cost is \$1,480.00 *plus labor.

Network-attached storage (NAS) is dedicated file storage that enables multiple users and assorted devices to retrieve data from centralized storage. Our office staff via the local area network (LAN) is able to access the shared storage. It is also a backup for our files. Cost is \$1,030.00 *plus labor.

The Elders approved a Special Voter's Assembly to extend a Call, for our next Pastor, when the Call Committee is prepared to recommend new names. The meeting day, date and time will be widely publicized. God willing it will be in March.





A long time ago, a close Christian friend of mine told me this true story: His church had a choir with many singers. Before each practice, the choral director invited a choir member to pray. Everybody was given the opportunity. Once he pointed to a lady who was active in the church, and asked her to pray. Everyone bowed their heads and closed their eyes waiting for her to pray. To everyone's surprise, she started to cry. The director asked if she was okay. The lady responded, "I don't know how to pray". This is not an isolated case, because it's true that many Christians do not pray regularly. They do not understand that taking the time to pray to the Lord is one of the best ways to show our devotion, our trust and our dependability on God. Sadly, there are many Christians who say they are too busy to find the time to pray and show respect and gratitude to their Lord. 
